TREATY 6


Treaty 6 territory - the ancestral and traditional territory of the Cree, Dene, Blackfoot, Saulteaux, Nakota Sioux, as well as the Métis. Together we acknowledge the many First Nations, Métis and Inuit whose footsteps have marked these lands for generations as well as their interaction with all other cultures during timeframes that are still part of historical debate.

All parties are grateful for the traditional Knowledge Keepers and Elders who are still with us today and those who have gone before us – all cultures and peoples that is. There is recognition of land as an act of reconciliation and gratitude and territory as it belongs to those who title it – each to its own.

Treaty 6 was signed by Crown representatives and Cree, Assiniboine and Ojibwa leaders on 23

August 1876 at Fort Carlton, Saskatchewan, and on 9 September 1876 at Fort Pitt, Saskatchewan.

The treaty boundaries extend across central portions of present-day Alberta and Saskatchewan.
