Resources for the Summer Village of Sandy Beach.

Please consider printing out this information for easy access in case of an emergency.

Emergency Situations are always served most appropriately by calling 911. This will connect you with the best services to help in a crisis. Examples for this include any crimes that are immediately threatening of life or property, fire, significant injuries, medical crisis situation, etc.

Any Fire, Ambulance, or Police needs within the village are serviced by 911 services. There is a fee for some services (including but not limited to fire), so it is very important to contact your homeowner insurance to ensure you have appropriate coverage. We have fire departments available to serve our village, please be aware that costs for the services are incurred by the resident who uses the service.

In Alberta, the RCMP serves as the provincial police force, as is the case in all provinces except Ontario and Quebec.

The RCMP enforce both provincial statutes and the Criminal Code of Canada.

Morinville and area (including our village) is policed 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, however, office hours are: Monday to Friday 8:00 am to 4:30 pm.

If there are concerns regarding non-emergency situations, the Village of Sandy Beach is served by the RCMP detachment in Morinville (<http://www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/detach/en/d/529>).

They address concerns with a triaged process taking into account the immediate need of the concern. Please contact the complaints number for non-emergency situations.

Whether on your own property or not, your dog is not allowed to be a nuisance to any resident. By definition, nuisance includes waste and disposal of waste, trespass on another property, a threat to public safety or noise. Your dog is not allowed to howl, bark or yelp excessively or in any manner that unreasonably interferes with the use and/or enjoyment of any property.

If any dog, while off the owner's property and whether or not on a leash, attacks a person or another animal, or chases or challenges a person, it can be deemed vicious.

Please contact the **Alberta SPCA** to report dogs that are off lease, on private property or without a owner supervision.
