**5. Administrative Services Agreement – Further to our discussion during the last meeting, the Executive Committee met with Wildwillow Enterprises Inc. in December 2018 to negotiate an extension of the administrative services agreement for the SVLSACE group. A copy of the proposed agreement will be available for the meeting, but in general the terms are to preform the services as listed in the operating guidelines for a base fee of 2,400/year (unchanged dollar amount from the last contract), \$0.60/km for travel, and the addition of a \$40/hr charge for approved extra work (such as work related to hosting the Regional Meetings, etc. which are not regular budget costs or operating duties). The agreement is for 2019, 2020 and 2021 and includes no annual inflation (*approve agreement as presented*).**

**6. 2019 Budget, Requisitions and 3yr Budget Proposal – A copy of the proposed budget is attached. This draft includes a 2019 Operating Budget (with comparison to 2018 Budget and Actuals), a requisition calculation sheet based on the 2019 draft budget, and a 3 Year Operating Budget Projection as requested during the last meeting. Details will be discussed during the meeting (*approve the budget, as presented or amended, and authorize administration to issue the requisitions*).**

**7. Revenue and Cost Sharing Committee (Facility Map Request) – Two Items:**

- a) The Revenue and Cost Sharing Committee met late in January and again in February. The Committee had met in previous years but had grant money left to allocate and has been working on a project for this. The project they came up with was to RFP for a “Parks, Recreation and Culture Strategic Assessment and Plan” on related facilities and assets within all member communities. This will help members

plan their own asset rehabilitation schedules and also help in the discussion on establishing a mandate for any future regional recreation committee frameworks. In making this request, the committee has requested 2 key piece of information a) a list of all your recreation and culture facilities, including parks and playgrounds) and b) a map of your community showing the location of these facilities within your municipalities. I believe most have submitted a list already, but the map is a new request and we are asking that you bring a map to the meeting for administration to collect or provide a map no later than March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 (request members provide the requested information and map).

b) Chairman Poulin would also like to have a discussion on summer village thoughts about the Regional Recreation Committee, a discussion which stemmed from the Revenue and Cost Sharing Committee – further to the January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2019 meeting on this matter hosted by Lac Ste. Anne County.

8. **Northern Gateway, Rural Symposium** – Judy Muir, Chairwoman of the Northern Gateway Public School Board forwarded a request to our individual municipalities earlier this year. This invitation requested that councils consider sending representation to the Rural Education Symposium scheduled for March 3 – 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019 in Edmonton. I don't recall seeing this request in the past, however given this is likely to be an election year for the province and there is a thorough debate being had over rural funding model options this may be worth going to. Many of our member communities have asked that SVLSACE consider sending representation on behalf of the group. Chairman Poulin is requesting that we have a specific discussion on sending joint representation from SVLSACE, as well as a general discussion on what topics the group would might want these reps to bring up if the opportunity arises. The registration is \$400 per person – so if 2 reps go for all three days it would be about upwards of \$1,750 including travel (*authorize attendance of \_\_\_\_\_ or accept for information*).
  9. **Flowering Rush, ACP Grant Update and Request for 2019 Donations** – A regional partnership including Lac Ste. Anne County, Alexis First Nation, Silver Sands, South View, West Cove and the Lake Isle and Lac Ste. Anne (LILSA) Water Quality Management Society applied for an ACP grant in 2018 to study the flowering rush problem in Lake Isle and the surrounding watershed, and come up with an abatement strategy. This grant was approved and that committee will begin meeting soon. The grant does not cover "implementation" activities and LILSA is working to get their own grants and funds available to do the prescribed abatement work wherever possible. A request for donations went out to Lake Isle and Lac Ste. Anne communities late in 2018 and some additional support has been received. Chairman Poulin is also chair of LILSA and will have more detail on the during the meeting (*here for discussion, provide direction as warranted*).
  10. **FCM** – Chairman Poulin has been asked to consider attending the spring session of FCM – Federation of Canadian Municipalities – along with other regional partners including councillors from Lac Ste. Anne County. There will be a focus on rural connectivity, wireless and communication infrastructure, water and wastewater infrastructure and other important initiative that impact our communities directly. Most summer villages do not get the opportunity to send representation to FCM as it is often cost prohibitive – but Chairman Poulin would like to discuss if this is something SVLSACE would consider beneficial. Chairman Poulin will provide more details on the programme and costs during the meeting (*here for discussion, provide direction as warranted*).

11. **Regional Municipalities Meeting** – The SVLSACE are scheduled to host the next Regional Municipalities Meeting. Chairman Poulin would like to have a quick discussion on possible agenda topics the members would like to see on the programme as well as seek tentative confirmation of a proposed date, and location. The suggested date is May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 from 9am to 2pm at the Agliplex in Alberta Beach. We have budgeted to allow for 75 people at \$10 per person for light lunch/snacks, plus supplies, hall rental, etc. (*confirm date and location, any agreed-to agenda items*).

**TOPIC:**

ASVA's Provincial Election Strategy

**BACKGROUND:**

It is now known that the Throne Speech will be held March 18, 2019 with the expectation that the government will drop the writ shortly after. Elections therefore are expected to be held in April or May.

As of Jan. 10, the United Conservative Party (UCP) led all provincial parties with 79 confirmed candidates out of 87 electoral ridings. The Alberta Party was in second with 54 and the governing NDP was in third with 34. The Alberta Liberal Party and Green Party were tied with seven confirmed candidates, while Derek Fildebrandt's Freedom Conservative Party had one.

**PROVINCIAL ELECTION STRATEGY**

The ASVA's objective in the upcoming election is to ensure that all political parties are aware of the value of the ASVA as a municipal association and the viability of summer villages in Alberta.

Our role, as the ASVA, is to inform all political parties that:

1. The ASVA is one of three municipal organizations in Alberta along with the AUMA and RMA.
2. The ASVA is here for the long term and that we have been in existence for 60 years.
3. Summer villages are viable, collaborative with their adjacent municipalities and are paying their own way.
4. MSI Base Level funding - Summer villages are no longer seasonal municipalities and that we need to be treated like any other municipalities from a funding perspective (including infrastructure funding).
5. Lake Stewards - Summer villages play an important stewardship role in relation to our adjacent lakes and waterbodies as per Alberta's Water for Life program.
6. Safe Communities – ASVA is concerned with rural/urban interface of crime and enforcement, and the need for an updated approach to policing and bylaw enforcement.

Our strategy must be two-fold:

1. One happening immediately prior to the election
2. One happening immediately after the election

**PRIOR TO THE ELECTION**

To undertake a strategy, we must rely on all Board Directors and our members to send out our message to all parties in the Alberta Legislature.

**Strategy**

1. Build support within the government and opposition by:
  - a. Attending engagement sessions/opportunities such as political rallies, etc.
  - b. Meeting with your MLA especially if they are anticipated to play a major role in their party
  - c. Provide a template to our members for providing feedback back to the ASVA on what they heard and/or responses from their meetings so that we can adjust our strategy
2. Provide a script/key messages and potential questions to all of our members so that they can also engage in the above (2a.,2b., 2.c.) and attend local candidate forums
3. ASVA to write to the leader of each party's official office giving them a fact sheet on the ASVA and Summer Villages and our key messages. We should also ask them to confirm their support for our organization and summer villages in Alberta
4. Template letters for summer villages to send to their MLAs
5. Sample news releases for summer villages to send to their local newspapers.

**FOLLOWING THE ELECTION**

1. Send a handwritten card of congratulations to the winning party and their ministers
2. Have the ASVA Executive meet with all key cabinet ministers and repeat the key messages
3. Follow up on the party support (and promises – if any)
