Conditions per Bylaw: 04-2019

- The applicant resides on the property on which the Hens will be kept, the applicable fee has been paid and all required information has been provided;
- No person shall keep, harbor, train or breed any livestock, exotic pets or non-domestic animals or fowl within the Village boundaries;
- No person shall keep a rooster or keep a Hen, other than an Urban Chicken for which a valid Chicken License has been issued;
- A person may apply to keep no more than six (6) Urban Chickens by: submitting a completed application, on the form approved by the Village Administration and paying a license fee of \$15.00;
- A license may not be issued or renewed unless the applicant is the owner of the property on which the Urban Chickens will be kept, or that the owner of the property has provided written consent to the application;
- The land use districting of the property on which the Urban Chickens will be kept allows the placement of a Coop for the keeping of Urban Chickens;
- The Coop must be constructed and maintained to prevent any rodent from harboring underneath or within it or within its walls, and to prevent entrance by any other animal;
- Provide each Hen with at least 0.37 m² of interior floor area, and at least 0.92 m² of outdoor enclosure, within the Coop;
- Provide and maintain, at least one nest box per Coop and one perch per Hen, that is at least 15 cm long.
- Keep each Hen in the enclosed Coop area at all times along with keeping a food container and water container in the Coop;
- Maintain the Coop in good repair and sanitary condition, and free from vermin and noxious or offensive smells and substances;
- Store feed within a fully enclosed container; and keep manure within a fully enclosed container, and store no more than 3 cubic feet of manure at a time;
- Provide each Hen with food, water, shelter, light, ventilation, veterinary care, and opportunities for essential behaviors such as scratching, dust-bathing, and roosting, all sufficient to maintain the Hen in good health;
- Not slaughter, or attempt to euthanize, a Hen on the property, there must not be any disposal of a Hen except by delivering it to a farm, abattoir, veterinarian, or other operation that is lawfully permitted to dispose of Hens; and keep a Hen in a cage, kennel or any shelter other than a Coop.
- Sale of eggs, manure, meat and other products associated with the keeping of Hens is prohibited.
- An Urban Hen Permit is not transferable from one person to another, or from one property to another.
- A tenant must have completed appointment of agent form signed by the landowner.
